

STATE OF THE LAKES Courtesy Boat Inspectors



- CBI: Inspectors check boats for any invasive hitchhikers
- Expect fully staffed paid inspectors during primary hours this year.
- With more volunteers, we could protect during additional timeframes.






- 3 species grow above the water along Lake Penn shore.
- Much easier to find and remediate than aquatic invasives.
- A lot was done last year - but more remains to be done.
- We don't have a full team this year. We need volunteers to continue!



STATE OF THE LAKES Invasive Plant Patrol (IPP)



- Can't let aquatic invasives get a foothold. Finding them early in shallow water is essential to saving a lake.
- Trained IPPers search a sector for possible invasives once a year.
- We have many volunteers, but we have turnover. More volunteers means we can have more "Eyes on our Lakes."

STATE OF THE LAKES Water Quality Monitoring



- Team collects water samples from each lake once/month (May to September).
- Some analysis & sample preparation for state lab.
- Need volunteers to grow the team. Each volunteer would most likely measure water quality in 1 or 2 lakes per month.



STATE OF THE LAKES Erosion Control



 This is a critical program, since watershed erosion is perhaps the biggest threat to our lakes.



 Volunteers will learn how to help property owners understand erosion and recommend remediation actions, support grant work, and participate in LAON's Watershed Protection Program (WPP).

FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT – Tom Webster

- Financial condition is stable
- Dues/donations are on target
- Interest Income has increased
- Currently about one-third of property owners donate. Their engagement and interest is as important as money
- Costs are increasing for:
 - Water quality testing higher costs + Hobbs Pond Special Testing
 - Courtesy Boat Inspections increased minimum wage and tight job market
 - Invasive plant survey
- New Watershed Protection Program:
 - \$17,145 in 2023-2024 for Watershed Remediation
